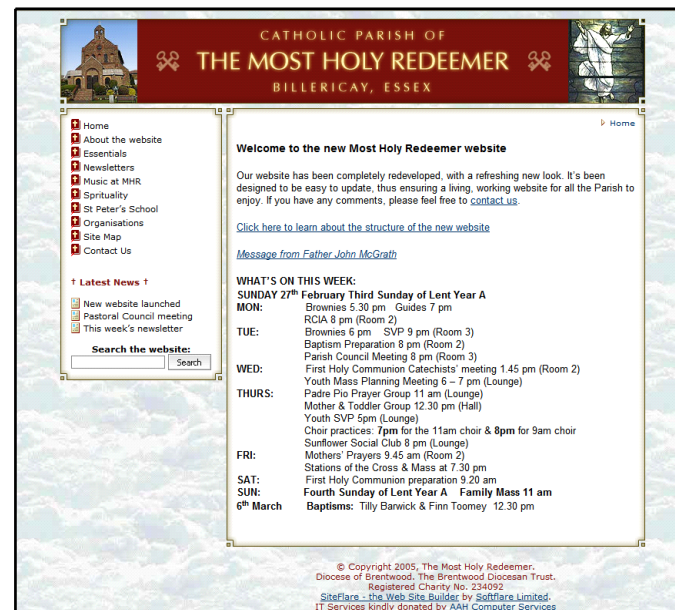
## NEW PARISH WEBSITE LAUNCHED!

# Website layout

The front page is kept as simple as possible, with the home page always showing what's on this week and as little clutter as possible. Any really important messages will appear here.

**Home:** This is the main page, and is kept as simple as possible, with useful links and most importantly the current week's *what's on* section

**About the website:** This section has information about how to navigate the site, as well as a link to the old website, which is still available for reference purposes

**Essentials:** This section has general information about the church, for visitors and in the case of emergencies. When the user first clicks on *Essentials*, the *Mass Times* page shows, with other pages showing in the submenu.

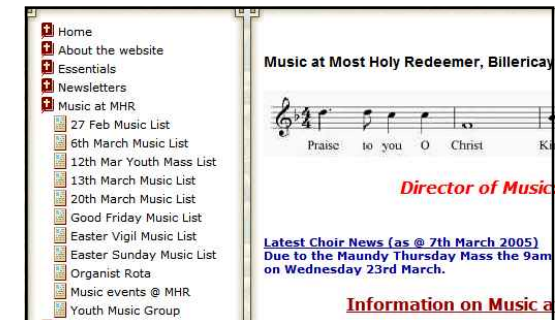
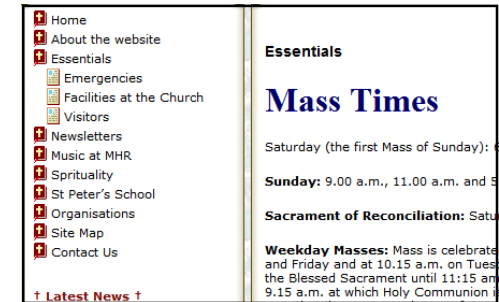
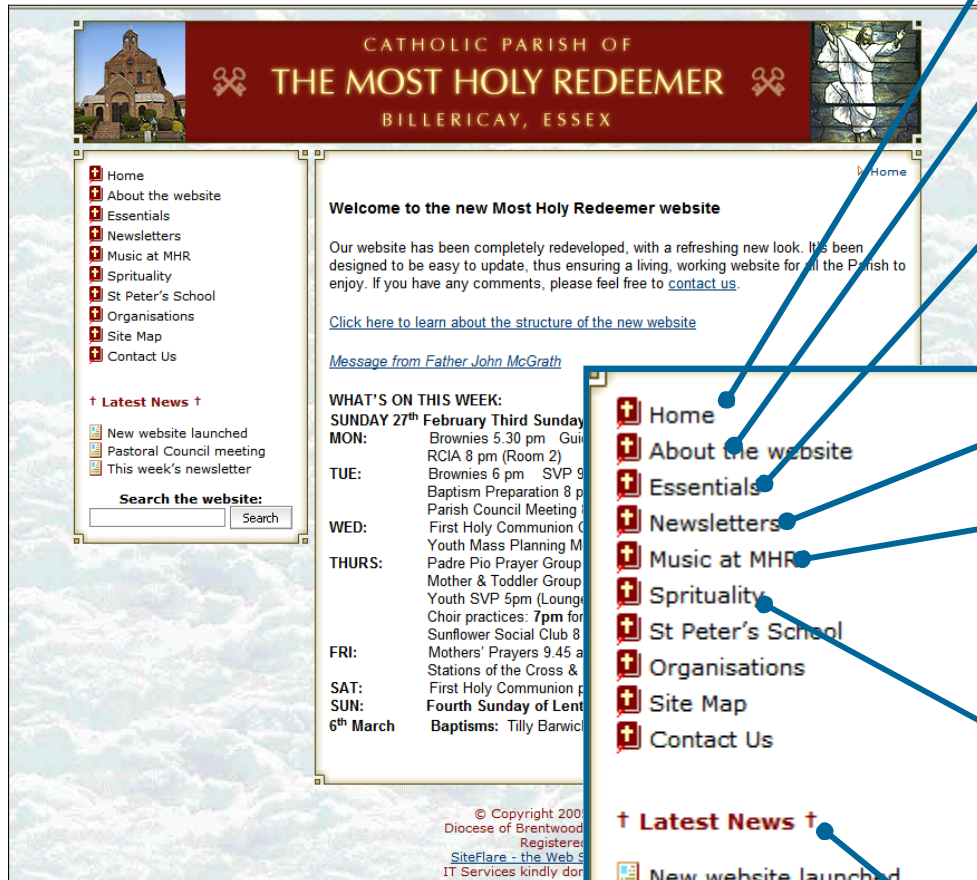
**Newsletters:** This section contains an archive of the weekly newsletters, in an easy to read format, starting from February 2005

**Music at MHR:** This section shows the current week's music lists.

**Spirituality:** Has subsections on Prayers, the Sacraments and articles and information about faith-sharing

The remaining sections are fairly self-explanatory, and will be added to and revised on a regular basis.

**Latest News:** In this section, you'll find regularly changing articles concerning upcoming events, as well as this week's newsletter, always freshly updated at the weekend.



All navigation is done through the menu on the left, which is split into main items and "latest news".
